### 1.1 Additional information

The scope of the abstract should be clear. You should explain the problem area that you wish to address, the methods that you used, the novelty of your approach, the general significance of your contribution. You need to present results and/or conclusions. Relevant references are required, figures, and tables are welcome. Please note that

- we only accept abstracts in .pdf format;
- the extended abstract must not be longer than 4 pages incl. references;
- the maximum file size allowed is 1MB;
- the abstract must be written in English.

The acceptance of the abstract will be communicated to the authors in March 2015, to be confirmed. The authors will have a chance to replace there extended abstract with a revised abstract.

## 2 METHODOLOGY

The authors should ensure that their work is original, and acknowledge in an appropriate manner any work of other authors, contributors or sources (including online sources), correspondence and discussion with third parties. All those who have made significant contributions should be listed as co-authors. Plagiarism constitutes unethical publishing behaviour and is unacceptable.

Multiple, concurrent or redundant manuscript submission for publication constitutes unethical publishing behaviour and is unacceptable.

All authors should disclose in their manuscript any conflict of interest that might be construed to influence the results or interpretation of their conclusion. All sources of financial support should be appropriately disclosed.
